



# SRCEZAŠAPU

**ANNUAL REPORT**

2018

*Nobody knows the exact number of homeless dogs in Sanski Most municipality. They are on the streets in the town, as well as in the woods around. However, the most of them are on the garbage dump, where people usually abandon unwanted dogs. From time to time, when the number of dogs on the streets increases and when people start to complain, the municipal dog-catcher take them to the garbage dump and leave them there to die from hunger, mutual attacks and illness... or, they drive them to the hunting area where hunters have right to kill them. No neutering actions have been conducted ever (although the money for this type of project have been invested in municipal budget by international organization). This is a sad truth about "solving the problem" of stray dogs in Sanski Most / Bosnia and Herzegovina.*



*Dear friends,*

*The year 2018 left us with mixed feelings. We started with a brave and seemingly unattainable vision, which many did not believe in. But then, in spacious courtyards surrounded by greenery, houses for the collective accommodation of abandoned and discarded dogs were arisen. They were planned and built with a lot of love and based on our knowledge and experiences about the needs and habits of dogs. We built quarantine and a space for dogs reception, the terrain was leveled and fenced, the sewage system, the water and electricity were connected. We are proud and happy when we see all of this, but at the same time we feel disappointment - all the efforts that we invested did not result in moving dogs from the temporary shelter on the garbage dump, where we are spending the fourth year now.*

*Furthermore, we are happy because of the great support provided by our friends and sympathizers from all over the world, because of the people who entered our lives and joined our mission, but also outraged and disappointed by the misunderstanding of the authorities and citizens of Sanski Most, a town that will have a big benefit from what we do.*

*We are happy that hundreds of dogs from the temporary shelter at the garbage dump are fed and cheerful, despite extremely inhumane conditions. One of the key values in our work is fulfilled - dogs are not in cages, they are not isolated from each other and receive daily human attention and care. We put a lot of effort into maintaining hygiene. Also, we make sure that dogs that live in a cramped space can live in peace, without mutual conflicts that would jeopardize their security. At the same time, we are overwhelmed by grief, watching small dogs infected with a parvovirus dying, and it makes us extremely sad that we can't help them. We are sadly watching our good paws, pure souls, that are patiently waiting for the better conditions, and who naively and unconditionally rejoice at every human being who comes to see them.*

*Perhaps our goals are too ambitious. Maybe we are giving ourselves more tasks than we can take. We did not succeed in achieving everything we planned in 2018, but our patience, desire and faith lead us further on into the future.*

*Therefore, as we enter the 2019, we can say that we are proud of what SRCEZAŠAPU has achieved and excited about the near future. 2019 will be the year of fulfillment of our dreams!*

# Key Information about the SRCEZAŠAPU

We are group of passionate individuals who registered non-profit, non-governmental organization SRCEZAŠAPU in September 2015. Since then, we run no-kill dog shelter in Sanski Most. Our mission is to relieve homeless dogs from suffering and pain and to enable them a safe, healthy and happy life.

In order to achieve this aim, we defined five objectives:

1. To remove the dogs from the temporary dog shelter based on the garbage dump to the “Land of Happy Dogs” – the unique dog shelter built and managed in accordance with dogs’ needs and nature.
2. To increase adoption rate of the dogs from the shelter to suitable national and international adopters’ for at least 50% - by raising awareness of people about our responsibility for homeless animals and the advantages of growing up and living with animals.
3. To reduce the number of stray dogs in the municipality by raising awareness for responsible dog ownership, advocating for chipping/registering and by neutering of stray and owned dogs.
4. To protect animal rights and decrease different forms of cruelty towards animals by reporting perpetrators to the authorities and lobbying for implementation of sanctions prescribed by the Law.
5. To ensure organizational and financial sustainability of the “Land of Happy Dogs”

Members of the Governing Board largely finance all costs and voluntarily perform tasks related to the organization / shelter management, reporting and promotion, as well to the direct work with dogs in the shelter. We are:

The shelter that we run has a permanent employment relationship with two people – Selma Huzejrović (veterinarian technician) and Muhamed Okčić.

They take care of the dogs seven days a week, during the working hours from 08.00 to 16.00.



# The municipal dog shelter on the garbage dump

The shelter that we currently run was made by local government in year 2010 as part of its legal obligation, but when we came it was abandoned and in terrible condition – there were just hungry, thirsty and sick dogs wandering around the garbage dump, where this shelter of 190m<sup>2</sup> was actually made. In these chaotic circumstances we took over to manage this municipal „shelter“, **but only as a temporary solution.**

In order to make it even remotely acceptable for dogs' accommodation and care, we cleaned the area and made necessary repairs, expanded the space with new 600m<sup>2</sup> fenced area and 30m<sup>2</sup> houses for collective accommodation, built the roof in the central part of the shelter (190m<sup>2</sup>), built fences in order to accommodate groups of dogs in four separate yards (each for 20 dogs) and ensured water supply.



The conditions in the shelter are far from what it was at the beginning of our work, but is not even close to the normal. At December 31, 2018 we had 98 dogs placed on 790m<sup>2</sup>, operating in extremely unhealthy environment. Regardless of our efforts the grounds is fully unsuitable in terms of maintaining the hygiene. Poisonous water from garbage dump flushes directly into the shelter and the whole area is inhabited with rats, so there is a constant risk of spreading dangerous diseases.

It is literally impossible to clean dogs of parasites, fleas and ticks because the area is contaminated and all our efforts mostly are gone in vain. The ground is infected with parvovirus and that has disastrous consequences on mortality of the puppies. The accommodation facilities for dogs are extremely small and in very bad condition. There is no quarantine, so diseases spread rapidly. Furthermore, there is no proper storage facility and housing for workers, there is no electricity, while water supply is improvised, so during summer we have problems with water shortage, while during the winter the water pipes are frozen.

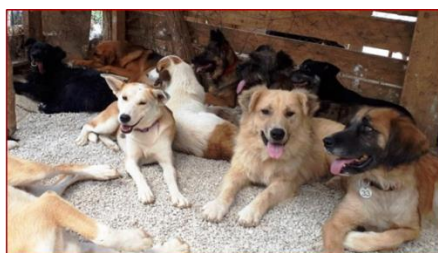
**And yet, even in these horrifying circumstances, we have found ways to make dogs happy and enjoy life.**



# Results 2018

## Socialized dogs

We allow free movement outside the kennels for each animal, and we are especially proud of that. The exceptions are the female dogs with puppies, juniors and sick and frightened dogs that are closed in the kennels, but only during the night. For this to happen, dogs have to learn to socialize and become peace-minded. This is not always easy and requests lots of patience and love, especially in such a cramped space. Furthermore, abandoned dogs experienced violence and neglect, which makes it even more difficult.



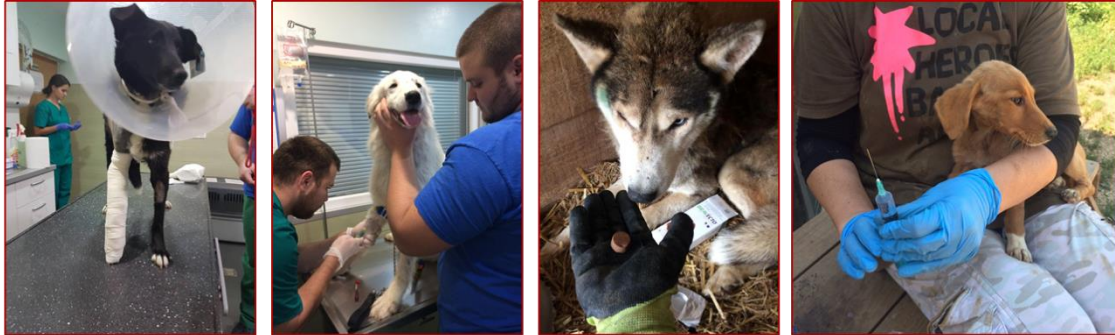
## Neutered 25 dogs

Prior to the resettlement of dogs to the new shelter, we intensified neutering actions. Totally 25 dogs were neutered in Veterinary ambulances Sanski Most and Prijedor: Alfi, Shanti, Bendži, Malik, Oliver, Lajka, Buca, Carrot, Goldi, Hera, Zlatka, Negra, Dora, Melek, Foxy, Lija, Tara, Korana, Bleki, Rambo, Šiljo, Tommy, Šeki, Drekač and Jazz.



## Two surgeries and other medical interventions

Sana and Vučko had broken legs and surgeries were successfully done in orthopedic clinic in Bihać; Aura, Lu and Šeki are cured from demodicosis; more than 30 puppies got anti-parvo vaccine and ill puppies got medical aid; dogs were regularly treated against internal and external parasites.



## Four forever loving homes



Just four!? Yes! Adoption is a critical issue that seriously endangers the sustainability and purpose of our work. In the country where thousands of abandoned and hungry dogs wander around, where people are in a state of hopelessness due to the political, economic and moral crises, adoption is no one's priority. In most cases, people who come seeking to adopt a dog only want a guard dog to put in a box or tie to a chain, where he should spend the rest of his life. This kind of adoption is not acceptable for us. In some cases, people just want a toy for their child that will be there for a while and later they will abandon it – like Hugo who mysteriously disappeared, or Kira who is after six months returned to the shelter.



So here they are – four happily adopted dogs: Maya in Sanski Most, and Sana, Luna and Lucy in Croatia and Slovenia.



## Volunteers

Year 2018 was marked with increased number of people who expressed willingness to help abandoned dogs by voluntary engagement. It is not only about the assistance they provided in and for our shelter – their involvement is much more valuable to us - Zlata, Keno, Medina, Merjem, Arijana, Edim, Amer, Gena, Elna, Edina and Sara give us the strength to persevere!



There are new volunteers who contribute in building the Land of Happy Dogs too. Among them, the couple from Switzerland – Zlata and Marcel, who have joined our team and provided help in many ways – by fundraising and launching Leechicrowd – funding platform, lobbying for the Land of Happy Dogs, working on the construction site and by restoration of the old kiosk to serve as a “maternity” in new shelter. Besides Zlata and Marcel, again we had a visit of group of women from Bosnia. Željana, Vanja and Gena, together with Board members Eni and Ivona have been working on access paths to the dog houses. Dino helped in building the stone stairs in front of one house for dogs, while Ermin made beautiful dog house.





# The Land of Happy Dogs

**From the very first day our mission is to remove the dogs from dangerous, unhealthy, depressing, degrading and inhumane garbage dump to the “Land of Happy Dogs”, where abandoned dogs will live in a scenic and healing environment among human and animal friends - until adoption.**

With that aim, in year 2016 Board members bought the land size 18.500 square meters and it is given to the association SRCEZAŠAPU to build and manage new shelter. After two years of exhausting administrative procedure, in July 2018, we finally got the Building Permission and started with works.

One of its kind – the “Land of Happy Dogs” will have open dog houses for collective accommodation, with roofed porches in the front of the sleeping areas, placed in spacious yards surrounded by trees - only for dogs’ exercise, playing and enjoying the nature. **No metal dog kennels, no chains!** This is our policy and core value from the very beginning of our work and it will be fully applied in the “Land of Happy Dogs”.



By December 31<sup>st</sup> we have built three dog houses and quarantine (each size 15.6m x 5.40m), as well the reception facility (3x3m) for bathing dogs. Furthermore, the estate is fenced, terrain leveled, sewerage system connected to two sewers and the water and electricity are connected to the construction site.

In follow up period we also plan to build small facilities for non-socialized dogs that need special care to adapt to the new environment and the facility for dog mothers with puppies, each with their own yards.

Besides facilities for dogs’ accommodation, construction project envisaged the central building (10mx9m) with the **veterinarian ambulance** that will enable conducting proper healing of the dogs, as well conducting the neutering actions for stray and owned dogs in Sanski Most municipality by veterinarians engaged on contract. Several veterinarians and organizations are ready to conduct neutering pro bono for us, but currently, on the garbage dump, without veterinarian centre, electricity and proper water supply it is impossible.

From the very beginning of this voyage we have invested **60.173 EUR**. The costs have been covered in three modalities - given as donation in good or services, paid directly to the supplier by “Srce za šapu” Board members, or paid via Srce za šapu account from money donated by Governing Board members and our sympathisers. Only costs paid via Srce za šapu account are presented in our monthly financial reports and annual accounts:

Besides providing dogs with a magical space tailored to their needs, opening the doors of peculiar „Land of Happy Dogs“ will enable us to:

- ❑ **Increase adoption rate of the dogs to international adopters.** Currently we do not meet the requirements for obtaining a permit for adoption of dogs from the shelter abroad (this license has only six dog shelters in BiH). We urgently have to finalize the works in this project, get the license and provide these beautiful creatures with chances for decent and happy life.
- ❑ **Increase adoption rate of the dogs to suitable national adopters.** The awareness of the animal rights in BiH is extremely low - in most of the cases people treat their dogs without any empathy and love. However, the beauty and popularity of the this shelter will raise awareness about our responsibility for homeless animals and about the advantages of growing up and living with animals, thus increase readiness of local people to adopt dogs and treat them properly and responsible.
- ❑ **Reduce the number of homeless dogs** by neutering of stray and owned dogs for free in own ambulance, but also by raising awareness for responsible dog ownership and advocating micro-chipping the dogs.
- ❑ **Raise the funds for the organizational and financial sustainability of the “Land of Happy Dogs”**- since the uniqueness of the „Land of Happy Dogs“ and possibility to host volunteers and animal lovers will boost the effects of our fundraising efforts.

# Financial Operations 2018

The financial operations of the SRCEZAŠAPU are managed by the accounting firm MeAd d.o.o. from Sanski Most. Every month the Association publishes on its FB page the reports on donations and their use.

**The Land of Happy Dogs, as well as running the temporary shelter of the garbage dump, is exclusively financed by individuals - by us who are the Board members, with support from our friends and sympathizers. Up to now we did not get contribution from any foundation or governmental institution.** According to our monthly reports, in year 2018 totally 52.943 EUR (103.549 BAM) was invested in maintaining the municipal shelter and constructional works for the Land of Happy Dogs.

# Plans for 2019

Members of the Governing Board have set following objectives for year 2019. During 2018 we were financially exhausted, so the success will largely depend on the support we receive on our way.

- ❑ **Removal to the "Land of Abandoned Dogs" and closing the shelter on the garbage dump:** The Board members already intensified activities in writing project proposals and sending circular letters, as well as promotion on social networks and electronic media in order to collect necessary funds and move the dogs to their promised land. The removal is expected by summer 2019.
- ❑ **Management of the municipal shelter at the garbage dump:** Until the relocation, we must ensure basic conditions in the shelter on garbage dump. In addition to the usual activities related to nutrition, cleaning and health care, this also includes permanent repairs of the existing kennels and external and internal fences, purchasing straw for winter days etc.
- ❑ **Adoption abroad:** In the interest of the dogs, but also with the aim of achieving the shelter sustainability and reducing the number of stray dogs in Sanski Most municipality, our priority is to significantly increase the number of adopted dogs in year 2019. In order to become a so-called "go-through-shelter", we primarily intend to intensify partnerships with international organizations and networks involved in adoption. This will be possible after removal to the Land of Happy Dogs and getting TRACES, i.e. the permission for adoption of dogs abroad. SRCEZAŠAPU will provide necessary administrative and logistical assistance in obtaining passports and transportation of dogs in accordance with its financial capabilities. In addition, we plan to educate our employees how to train dogs, in order to be prepared for adoption. We will organize strict checks of international organizations and groups with which cooperation is established in order to prevent the risk of dog abuse.
- ❑ **Adoption in Bosnia and Herzegovina:** Speaking of dogs adoption in Sanski Most and BiH, our priority will be on promoting human-dog bond and values of living with animals. SRCEZAŠAPU will never give a dog for adoption "at any cost", endangering their rights and needs. We will seek lifelong, loving homes where dogs will be free from abuse, fear and loneliness and receive the care and respect they deserve. In case of adoption, we will continue conducting previous visits and monitoring, to make sure that a dog will be / is accommodated in a proper manner and according to the contract.
- ❑ **Sterilization:** After moving to the new shelter that will have the necessary conditions and be able to conduct of homeless dogs from Sanski Most municipality. This will be done in partnership with domestic and international programs active in this field.
- ❑ **Reducing the number of abandoned dogs and promotion and protection of animal rights:** We are aware that our long-term goal should be focused on the root of the problem - abandoned dogs are not the problem, people are. In year 2019 we will intensify promotional and lobbying activities, with special focus on local government to implement the Animal Protection and Welfare Act, which prescribes necessity for neutering of stray dogs and chipping and keeping records of owned dogs, as well as sanctions for irresponsible dog owners.

- ❑ **Financial sustainability of the dog shelter:** Our aim is to build a pool of at least 50 loyal individual donors who would orderly provide small monthly amount (5 to 20 BAM). It is also necessary to build a strategic approach to connecting with the Diaspora and creating a group of friends of the Association that will collect donations in money, food or other goods. Besides this, we will continue to work on development of project proposals for foreign and domestic donor organizations, ministries and companies. Lastly, in the long run, SRCEZAŠAPU could also think strategically about income activities or established social businesses whose profits would be used for funding the shelter.
- ❑ **Volunteer contributions to the work of the shelter:** Regardless of our frequent criticisms addressed to Sanski Most citizens, who have not yet shown too much willingness to volunteer by helping at the shelter, honestly speaking, it is hard to expect people to be ready to go to a garbage dump to play with dogs or walk them around the dump. Not to mention some of the more serious jobs such as cleaning the premises, bathing the dogs etc. By moving to the new location, we believe that citizens will be more willing to visit us, especially elementary and high school students, whose visits can be organized in cooperation with principals and teachers. Therefore, after the moving, we will strategically work on promoting and organizing visits and activities with a bigger volunteer participation – domestic and international.
- ❑ **Professional management of the shelter:** In order to ensure an effective management of the SRCEZAŠAPU, our long-term goal is to employ a Manager, who will work on planning, organizing and overseeing the human, financial and material resources of the organization, on dog adoption, keeping dog records, reporting, promotion and fundraising etc.
